## Oscar Mayer House (Interior)

**People have called this “the ivy house”** because of the overgrown ivy and landscape elements that dominated the house for years. Join DE colleagues and members of the Preservation Commission, Preservation League and Evanston History Center for the first of two guided tours of this exciting restoration. A second tour, planned for the fall, will feature the exterior restoration.

Designed by Hallberg & Sturm in 1901 for Charles Morgan Putnam, the home became the residence of Oscar Mayer who lived there from 1927-1965. It was purchased in 2015 by Jim Kastenholtz and Scott Hargadon. They hired architect John Eifler, whose team has rehabbed projects such as the Music Box Theatre and Garfield Park Conservatory. They will be our tour guides.
